# 100<sup>th</sup> Day Celebration Program at the CMA

The Children’s Museum of Acadiana will be celebrating a special day throughout the months of January and February. This program is known as the “100<sup>th</sup> Day Celebration” and marks the 100 days that children have been in school.

To celebrate this wonderful occasion, many activities reinforcing the concept of “what is a hundred”, have been designed for the months of January and February. All activities are oriented toward pre-k, kindergarten, and first grade students and are correlated with the Children’s Museum of Acadiana’s featured main exhibits and featured gallery exhibit if ready for visitors.



## Winn Dixie’s Le Petit Magasin Exhibit

Students will search for specially marked 100<sup>th</sup> Day celebration bundles packaged in groups of 5 fruits, vegetables, fish, or cookies. Students will be asked to shop for a specific number of bundles of 5 (depending on the number of students shopping) and will count the bundles of 5 up to 100.

## Bizzuka’s ReUSEum- Art Room

Students will create a mosaic drink tops by using strings of Mardi Gras beads cut in lengths of 10 or count 10 strings 10 Mardi Gras beads for a celebration shaker. If the gallery is featuring an exhibit such as Candy Cane Lane, students will count by tens to 100 to decorate their own Christmas tree. How many ornaments will they need to reach 100?

## **Kiwanis of Lafayette's Bubble Factory Exhibit**

Students will work together as a group to create 100 bubbles.

## **Café des Enfants (Restaurant) Exhibit**

Students will count ten bundles of crawfish or chili peppers. If there is an exhibit in the gallery such as Candy Cane Lane the group of students will count by tens as they place the Christmas cookies on the baking sheet. How many cookies will they need to reach 100?

## **Great Harvest Bread's - All About Me Health Gallery Exhibit**

In this exhibit space, students and teachers will complete 100 exercise moves that will help them stay happy and healthy!

## **Lafayette Vet. Care Center - Healthy Pet Hospital Exhibit**

Students will count by twos to distribute 100 treats to all of the CMA pets.

## **Architecture Alley**

Students will build a tower and count the number of blocks used.

## **Dots, Doodles, and Drawings**

Students will count by fives to connect the dots on a special 100<sup>th</sup> Day Celebration drawing or in the Candy Cane Lane Exhibit count items such as snowmen.

## Home Savings Bank Exhibit

Students will be given one container of pennies, one of nickels, and one of dimes. One of these containers will contain 100 coins. Students will be asked which container looks as though it has 100 coins.

## Dr. Keaty and Dr. Gouri's - To Tell the Tooth Dental Exhibit

Counting by twos students will use foam teeth and toothbrushes to create an A,A,B,B pattern counting to 100.

## Ami the Ambulance

Students will compare a 100-inch strip of gauze to a 100-centimeter strip of gauze and determine which is longer.

## Cypress Gallery

Cypress Gallery is a rotating gallery for special exhibits. Two (2) to three (3) times a year the museum changes this space into art exhibits, cultural exhibits, or special exhibits such as Candy Cane Lane. Each featured exhibition comes with its own special grouping of tens and fives. An example of a counting by fives or tens featured in the gallery exhibit, Candy Cane Lane, students will collect fallen snowflakes and group them by tens. Students will then conclude how many groups of tens are needed to collect 100 snowflakes.
